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Dear Parents and Carers,

We started October by celebrating the beginning of Black History Month with a great assembly on Monday afternoon. Thank you to Richard Stokes (parent governor) for organising this and pulling together a talented and knowledgeable team of people to deliver.

The children and new staff have now fully settled into life at The Dolphin School and I am looking forward to my first meeting with the class reps on 19th October.

Just to remind you that Mrs Triggol's farewell is on Monday 10th October from 3:20pm - 4pm in the downstairs hall at Fairlawn. This will give parents an opportunity to say your goodbyes over a cup of tea.

As I am sure you are all aware; punctuality is an important part of attendance. Arriving at school on time and ready to learn helps with the smooth transitions at the start of the day.

Therefore, with effect from 31st October, we are introducing a much clearer start to the school day:

On the Fairlawn site:

8am - 8:10am: arrive for breakfast club. The gate will be shut at 8:10am so anyone arriving after this will need to wait until 8:30am.

8:30am: gate opens to welcome the children and parents for the start of the day

8:50am: the tambourine will ring, children will go into class and the gate will be shut.

Children arriving after 8:50am will need to sign in at the Gatehouse and will be marked as late in the register. Parents will need to wait with their child until an adult is available to take them to class.

The registers will close at 9:15am. Children arriving after this will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

On the Dolphin site:

8am - 8:10am: arrive for breakfast club. The gate will be shut at 8:10am so anyone arriving after this will need to wait until 8:30am.

8:30am gate and classroom doors open.

8:45am classroom doors shut and registers open. Children arriving after this time will be marked as late and will need to wait in the school office area with their parents until they can be taken to class.

9:05am gates shut and children arriving after this time will be marked as authorised absence.

Adults can also learn to ride at the Centre or get their cycling confidence back in a supportive environment.

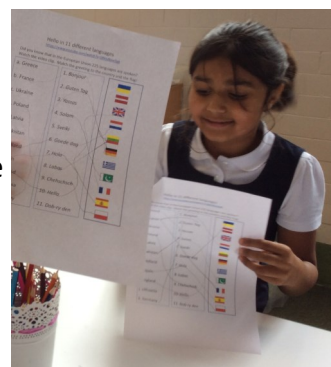
